- HW Practice #2: Google Classroom does not allow for parent access how does that jibe with this expectation? And some classes aren't necessarily complying.
- Additional thoughts
  - Having a "test center" for makeups
  - How much do these tests count?
  - Looking at the course selection process. Taking multiple challenging courses has the natural consequence of more testing
  - Re-imagining the schedule for end of quarter and other blackout times to build in breaks for kids
  - To what extent is our policy meeting its goal?
  - Importance of surveying students
