- Hate Crimes
  - Restorative Practices
    - Needs to be a district-wide commitment
- Cell Phones
  - Possible ideas
    - Cell phone storage container for each classroom
    - Education for students and parents/caregivers around digital responsibility
    - Discussion
      - One teacher said education is most important; the collection is a band-aid.
      - One student said it's more of an issue in minors than HH or AP classes. Even when phones are collected, students take them when they go to the bathroom.
      - One teacher feels strongly about collecting phones, cited data around the level of distraction for students when they have phones in their possession.
      - One teacher talked about some teachers' efforts this summer to work together to combat excessive phone use. Talked about the need to support students in their dysregulation around phones.
      - One teacher talked about how many students break through the firewall and access text and other distractions on iPads.
      - One parent emphasized the need for digital responsibility education
      - One parent talked about a tiered approach - different expectations based upon age.
      - One parent mentioned the issue of phones being away during an ALICE procedure
